

This is a very modern, cloud-based take on the idea of a textbook. Content is organized into readings with high interactivity (clickable links) and large, high-quality images. Less tech-savvy students may get lost if they click a vocabulary link and are taken away from the content, but more tech-savvy students should enjoy the interactive nature of the book. It would be nice to see some videos integrated into the content, but this is still a very strong resource as-is.

As mentioned previously, the images (and layout) of this book are very modern. Small chunks of information are given at a time, and users are encouraged to click through the readings to work through the content. Students would be well-served with integrated media content, too. For example, when the organization Toastmasters International is introduced, one of the Toastmasters YouTube videos could be integrated into the readings to clarify the organization. In the section "Sample Persuasive Speech," this is a great opportunity to use videos of the speeches, not just text pulled from their transcripts.

I know that students can download the Kindle or iBooks version of this book for \$9.99, but since the online content is always in flux, I'm not sure how closely the ebooks correlate to the online readings. This also makes printing the book a bit tricky, but to be fair, the major benefits from this book come from its cloud-based, interactive, online format. Boundless does not have built-in screen reading software, but they recommend students with visual disabilities use Clearly by Evernote to listen to the text. There is also a difference between the free books and the enhanced books with study tools (\$19.99 each), but the difference may be difficult for students to figure out (i.e., they may accidentally purchase the book when looking for the free version). This is reminiscent of Flat World Knowledge before they eradicated their free online options.

- My choice not to switch has nothing to do with the book itself, but rather with the amount of work that goes into switching textbooks.
 - The interactivity of this book is fantastic, and it's something that I think would keep my students engaged. The book would be improved by embedding media (like examples of speeches), but it's still a well-developed resource with lots of supplements.
